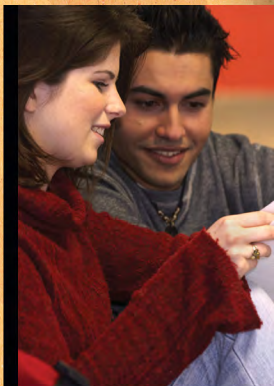

## You don't have to walk alone at night!

The **Campus Safety Escort Service (CSES)** provides volunteer escorts who will walk you to your car or a campus destination at night. **CSES** dispatches from the Tomás Rivera Library every Sunday through Thursday from dusk to midnight.

To request an escort, call **951.827.3772**, or use a **CSES** telephone located in most campus buildings.

After midnight, the **UCR Campus Police** will gladly provide an escort. Call **951.827.5222**.

## General Safety Tips

- ▶ Be aware and assertive. Learn to trust your instincts about your environment and the people around you.
- ▶ Keep emergency phone numbers handy. You can dial 911 directly from any public pay phone for free.
- ▶ Use the "buddy system" when out at night. There's safety in numbers.
- ▶ If you are waiting for someone to pick you up, wait in well-lit and well-traveled areas. When you approach your car or apartment, have your keys out and ready to unlock doors immediately.
- ▶ Appear and act self-confident. Many would-be attackers rely on the element of surprise. Walking with headphones on or while talking on a cell phone impairs your ability to be fully aware of your surroundings.
